

iPad Rules

<u>Misuse</u>	<u>Unattended</u>
<p>1) Being on a site students don't have permission to be on. For example: if the students are asked to be working in Pages and the teacher finds a student on Safari, it is misuse. Students need to ask for permission to leave Pages, even to find out information they need for the document.</p>	<p>1) The iPad should be left either in the student's desk or in the designated "safe" space in the classroom. Anywhere else in the school is deemed as unattended if it is not within reach of the student. Within the classroom students have 10 minutes to retrieve it, before it is considered unattended.</p>
<p>2) Not being where the student has permission to be within a site. For example: if the student is supposed to be sending their teacher an assignment in email, they don't have permission to be emailing a friend.</p>	
<p>3) Being on the iPad while the teacher is teaching and hasn't given the student permission to be using the iPad.</p>	
<p>4) Emailing without permission. For example: if a student wants to ask a friend a question about Sciences class and they are in a different classroom, the student needs to check with the teacher first.</p>	
<p>5) Students need permission or explicit instruction to use music. For example: if the teacher says when "I'm done speaking you can plug in" then students have permission.</p>	
<p>6) If the student has lost their iPad and they borrow someone else's then their iPad will be taken for double the time. The exception to this rule is if a teacher gives a student their iPad for testing.</p>	
<p>7) iPads are not allowed in the gym, unless instructed otherwise.</p>
